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Winemaking

Piedra Sagrada follows a classic Médocain approach with no filtration. Each of the 7 vineyard plots is vinified separately in small, truncated stainless steel vats (5,000L) using only native yeasts. Terroir specialist Éric Verdier personally selects and blends the final cuvée, which is then aged for 22 months in oak, Marsannay le Bois du Roy, France.

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Tasting note

A striking deep ruby hue with violet reflections. An expressive and elegant nose opens with layers of blackberries, spice, and cedar. The lingering aromas in the empty glass deepen into something truly captivating: hints of incense and myrrh mingle with raspberry preserves, wild strawberries, violets, and a final touch of liquorice root.

On the palate, it mirrors the aromatic complexity beautifully. From the very first sip, a wave of flavour unfolds — layered, vibrant, and precise. The tannins are exceptional: rich and textured, yet silky and refined, with no bitterness or harshness.

This is a wine of depth and balance, offering the kind of structure and grace that define great reds in outstanding vintages.
